ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Gilbert Medina, Jr., for want of prosecution.

After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed his appeal on February 26, 2009. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before March 30, 2009. The CDC filed the clerk's record with the Board on March 30, 2009. No reporter's record was filed. The Appellant's brief was due on or before April 29, 2009. The Appellant's brief has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief. A Show Cause Order was issued on June 2, 2009 giving the Appellant thirty (30) days to show cause why the appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant did not respond.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to refile same.
