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**Unopposed Motion for Continuance**

Comes Now, Richard Biggs, and respectfully moves for a continuance of this disciplinary proceeding.

Biggs received a reprimand in Case No. 2:23-CV-00026-Z in the Northern District of Texas, Amarillo Division, giving rise to this disciplinary proceeding. Biggs timely self-reported this reprimand to the State Bar of Texas (the “Texas Bar”), and the sole issue in this proceeding is whether the Texas Bar will issue a reciprocal reprimand.

Currently, the reprimand at issue is the subject of an appeal in Case No. 26-10194 in the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. As there has been no final determination regarding the reprimand, it is premature to determine whether a reciprocal reprimand should be issued in due course.<sup>1</sup>

Therefore, Biggs requests that the matter be continued due to the pendency of the appeal. Biggs requests that the matter be continued or abated until the reprimand is adjudicated by the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit.

Disciplinary Counsel is unopposed to this request.
