ORDER GRANTING RESPONDENT'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE

On this day, the Board of Disciplinary Appeals considered the First Unopposed Motion for Continuance filed by the Respondent, John F. Cuellar, in the above-captioned compulsory discipline case. Respondent requests a thirty-day continuance for the purpose of submitting the necessary paperwork to resign voluntarily in lieu of discipline. Respondent alternatively requests a remote hearing, should this matter proceed to a hearing before the Board. The Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, does not oppose Respondent's motion.

Respondent is currently authorized and eligible to practice law in Texas, but he has represented to the Board that he is not soliciting clients or making appearances on behalf of clients in any court.

The Board **GRANTS** Respondent's motion for a continuance and **ORDERS** that case will be removed from the July 28, 2023, hearing docket. The Board **ORDERS** Respondent to file with the Board by August 28, 2023, either (1) a copy of Respondent's motion for resignation in lieu of discipline filed in the Supreme Court of Texas; or (2) a status report regarding Respondent's voluntary resignation. If the Board then determines that this matter should proceed to a hearing, the Board will then decide the request for a remote hearing.

The Board further **ORDERS** Respondent to notify the Board immediately if Respondent resumes the representation of any clients in any matter.

Further continuance requests shall be disfavored.
