## **DISMISSAL ORDER**

On this day came to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above-captioned appeal for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in this matter, the Board finds that Appellant Michael L. Davis filed his notice of appeal on March 2, 2022. The clerk of the District 3 Grievance Committee of the State Bar of Texas filed the clerk's record with the Board on June 1, 2022. Pursuant to the BODA's Internal Procedural Rule 4.03, the reporter's record was also due to be filed by June 1, 2022. However, the reporter's record was not filed by that deadline.

On June 8, 2022, the Board sent Appellant a letter stating that the reporter's record had not been timely filed and requesting that Appellant ensure the reporter's record be filed within thirty (30) days. The letter notified Appellant that failure to file the reporter's record on time may result in the Board dismissing the appeal. Appellant did not respond, and the reporter's record was not filed by that deadline.

On August 25, 2022, the Board issued an order directing Appellant to respond and show cause within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the order why his appeal should not be *Dismissal Order Davis Page 1 of 2* 

dismissed for want of prosecution. Appellant did not respond, and the reporter's record still has not been filed.

In accordance with Internal Procedural Rules 4.03(a) and 4.09 of the Board of Disciplinary Appeals, and on its own motion, the Board **ORDERS** that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution, with prejudice to refiling.
