RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO STRIKE PETITIONER'S RESPONSE TO RESPONDENT'S MEMORANDUM IN OPPOSITION TO PETITIONER'S PETITION FOR RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE, OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE, MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE

TO THE BOARD OF DISCIPLINARY APPEALS:

COMES NOW, Respondent Robert B. Evans, III ("Respondent"), and files this Motion to Strike Petitioner's Response to Respondent's Memorandum in Opposition to Petitioner's Petition for Reciprocal Discipline ("Motion to Strike"), or in the alternative, Motion for Continuance ("Motion for Continuance"). In support thereof, Respondent would show the Board of Disciplinary Appeals ("BODA" or "Board") the following:

- 1. The above referenced reciprocal discipline matter is set for trial before BODA on Friday, July 26, 2024.
- 2. Rule 1.09(c) of BODA's Internal Procedural Rules provides that "[i]n any disciplinary proceeding before BODA, except with leave, all trial brief and memoranda must be filed with the BODA clerk no later than ten days before the day of the hearing."
- 3. On January 16, 2024, Respondent filed his Memorandum in Opposition to Petitioner's Petition for Reciprocal Discipline ("Respondent's Memorandum").
- 4. At 3:00 p.m. on January 25, 2024, Petitioner filed Petitioner's Response to Respondent's Memorandum ("Petitioner's Response"), with three hundred and fifteen pages of exhibits attached.

5. Petitioner filed Petitioner's Response less than twenty-four hours before the start

of trial, without obtaining leave as is required under Rule 1.09(c). In addition, Petitioner's

Response contains new information and asserts new allegations of professional misconduct against

Respondent which are not appropriately before the Board in this reciprocal discipline proceeding.

See TEX. R. DISCIPLINARY P. 9.03. Petitioner's exceedingly late filing deprives Respondent of his

opportunity to meaningfully respond to Petitioner's allegations against him and Petitioner should

not be permitted to engage in the disfavored practice of trial by ambush.

6. For the foregoing reasons, Respondent moves the Board to STRIKE Petitioner's

Response to Respondent's Memorandum in Opposition to Petitioner's Petition for Reciprocal

Discipline and to STIKE Petitioner's corresponding exhibits.

7. Alternatively, Respondent moves the Board to continue the trial set for July 26,

2024, to allow Respondent adequate time to respond to Petitioner's voluminous filing, which

contains three hundred and fifteen pages of exhibits and new allegations that are not contained in

the previous filings in this matter.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Respondent Robert B. Evans, III, prays that

the Board grant Respondent's Motion to Stike, or in the alternative, that the Board grant

Responsent's Motion for Continuance, and that the Board grant Respondent all such other and

further relief, at law or in equity, to which he may be justly entitled.
