ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Appellant, Travis M. Hartgraves, in State Bar of Texas Cause number D3110322748; BODA Cause No. 34919 for want of prosecution.

After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the notice of appeal was filed by the Appellant on March 30, 2005. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before April 29, 2005. The Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas (OCDC) filed the clerk's record with the Board on April 29, 2005. The reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing has not been filed nor has the Appellant requested an extension of time to file the reporter's record. Appellant's brief, which was due to be filed on May 29, 2005, has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief. This Board issued an Order to Show Cause to Appellant on July 30, 2005, giving Appellant 30 days to respond and show cause as to why this appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant did not respond.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to refile.
