ORDER DISMISSING PETITION FOR REINSTATEMENT
FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the Petition for Reinstatement after Disability filed by Paige Horelica for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Petitioner filed the Petition on March 9, 2012. The Respondent, Commission for Lawyer Discipline, moved for a continuance of the hearing and it was granted on April 13, 2012. The Respondent's second motion for a continuance was granted on May 23, 2012. In that order of continuance, the parties were instructed to inform the Board when discovery was complete or provide an update no later than November 30, 2012. No communication was received from the Petitioner as to the status of the case, despite two emails requesting the same: one on August 15, 2012 and one on December 12, 2012. Respondent's counsel responded, stating that he was not pursuing discovery at that time.

On March 25, 2013 an Order to Show Cause was issued by the Board of Disciplinary Appeals wherein the Petitioner was ordered to respond and show cause as to why the cause should not be dismissed. Petitioner did not respond.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this petition for reinstatement is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution without prejudice to refile.
