APPELLEE'S MOTION TO SUPPLEMENT THE RECORD

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Appellee, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline (“the Commission”), requests the Board, under authority of Rule 4.03(d) of the Board’s Internal Procedural Rules, to direct the clerk of the evidentiary panel to supplement the Clerk’s Record for the matter concerned in this appeal and held before the Evidentiary Panel of the Grievance Committee for State Bar District No. 7 (the “Evidentiary Panel”) as requested herein, for filing in this cause.

I.

It appears from the Clerk's Record that the Evidentiary Panel entered the Judgment of Disbarment at issue in this appeal, in Case No. 202205839, styled, *Commission for Lawyer Discipline v. Curtis Lilly*, finding Respondent, Curtis Lilly ("Lilly"), violated TDRPCs 1.03(a) and 1.14(a), on **September 22, 2025**, following an evidentiary hearing that took place on September 16, 2025. [CR 1079-1102]. E-mail communications by and between the clerk and the panel chair, on which the parties appear to have been copied, seem to confirm this. [Id.]. The table of contents for the Clerk's Record *also* indicates that the Judgment of Disbarment was filed on September 22, 2025. [CR Table of Contents, Item No. 60]. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Judgment of Disbarment included in the record is not file-stamped with the date of its filing, nor does it appear as signed by the panel chair. [CR 1105-09].

The Clerk's Record also reflects that Lilly filed a Motion for New Trial on **October 23, 2025**, and that after a hearing held on December 16, 2025, the panel issued an Order denying Lilly's motion on January 2, 2026. [CR 1103-18; 1199-1206]. However, similar to the Judgment of Disbarment, the Order denying Lilly's motion for new trial is not file-stamped with the date of its filing, nor does it appear as signed by the panel chair. [CR 1203].

The Clerk's Record was filed on January 20, 2026. Both the table of contents for the Clerk's Record and the dates of the corresponding e-mail communications contained in that record, *seem* to make clear in context that: (1) the Judgment of Disbarment was signed and entered by the panel on September 22, 2025; (2) Lilly's motion for new trial was filed on October 23, 2025; and (3) the Order denying Lilly's motion for new trial was signed and entered on January 2, 2026. However, for the sake of the clarity of the record in this matter, the Commission requests the Board direct the clerk of the evidentiary panel to supplement the Clerk's Record to include:

- (1) The file-stamped copy of the Judgment of Disbarment in this matter which includes the panel chair's signature;
- (2) The file-stamped copy of the Order denying Lilly's motion for new trial in this matter which includes the panel chair's signature; and
- (3) Any other supplementation necessary to provide the Board and the parties the complete Clerk's Record for review of this matter.

Appellee makes this request to clarify the dates of signing/filing of both the Judgment of Disbarment and the Order denying Lilly's motion for new trial, and to provide the complete record of the evidentiary proceedings for review. This motion does not seek to remove anything already in the record.

II.

For the foregoing reasons, Appellee requests that the Board direct the clerk of the evidentiary panel to supplement the Clerk's Record in this matter as requested

herein and to certify and transmit such supplemental Clerk's Record to the Board for filing in this cause.
