

ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day the Board of Disciplinary Appeals considered its own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Cornelius A. Long for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed his appeal on January 5, 2007. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before February 4, 2007. The clerk's record was filed with the Board on January 24, 2007. No reporter's record was filed. The Appellant's brief was due on or before March 4, 2007. The Appellant's brief has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief. This Board issued an Order to Show Cause on March 28, 2007, giving Appellant 30 days to respond and show cause as to why this appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant did not respond.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to the refilling of same.
