ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Pascual Madrigal for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed the notice of appeal on September 24, 2018. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before October 22, 2018. The Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas ("CDC") filed the clerk's record with the Board on October 22, 2018. The Appellant moved for additional time to file the reporter's record. The motion was granted and the reporter's record was due on or before November 26, 2018. It was not timely filed and, as of the date of this order, it has not been filed. Because the reporter's record was not filed, the Appellant's brief remained due on or before December 26, 2018. The Appellant's brief has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief.

An Order Show Cause was issued on January 8, 2019 giving the Appellant thirty (30) days to show cause why the appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant did not respond.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to refile.
