**ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION**

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Gordon M. White for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed his appeal on June 13, 2006. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before July 13, 2006. The Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas filed the clerk's record with the Board on July 12, 2006. No reporter's record was filed, and the Appellant did not request addition time for the reporter to file her record. Thus, the Appellant's brief was due on or before August 12, 2006. The Appellant's brief has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief. This Board issued an Order to Show Cause, directed to Appellant, on November 9, 2006, giving Appellant 30 days to respond and show cause as to why this appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant failed to respond to the Show Cause Order in any way.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to the re-filing of same.
